The doctors said her life expectancy would be about 4 or 5 years because of her complications. At age eight the doctors revised her shunt and said that it would last her the rest of her life which would be mid teens, no more than twenty. Jo Ann loved life and being surrounded by friends and family, she got her strength from us. She was always more concerned about how everyone else was doing than herself and she lived a full life to the age of 44. She amazed most doctors that she was still living when we did have to take her to the Hospital. Jo Ann was also a diehard Alabama fan and loved to shop at Bama Pride. Jo Ann was in the Specials Olympics, went to state and national in wheelchair race and softball throw. She graduated Shelby County High School and then went to the Mitchell Center and Adult Work Shop and she will be greatly missed by all

who knew her. Jo Ann is survived by sisters Brenda Stables, Denise Pate, Kathy Price, Paula Summerville and husband Preastley, Aindria Snell and husband Greg; brothers Dexter Butler and wife Mary Helen, Earl Butler and wife Mary, Rusty Price and wife Shannon and Adam Price and wife Stephanie.
