Robert Lee (Bobby) Godfrey, age 72, of Calera, met his Redeemer on Monday, July 27, 2015 in Birmingham, Alabama. He was born on July 12, 1943, in Natchez, Mississippi, weighing in at 4lb. He had a heart of gold and left this earth much better than he found it. He was raised by his grandparents and was forever thankful that they stepped in and took him in as one of their own. people laugh, baseball and sharing his love with others. He graduated from Calera High in 1961 and played all three sports and played them well. He married his high school sweetheart in 1961 and they enjoyed 54 years together. His favorite verse was Acts 20:35, "it is more blessed to give than to receive" and it showed in everything he did for others. He certainly, "fought the good fight, finished the race and kept the faith" and heard his Jesus say, "well done my good and faithful servant".
