In November 1951 Virginia found her passion as an independent sales representative with the Avon Company. For over 57 years, she was known in Columbiana and the surrounding area of Shelby County as the "Avon Lady". Through the years, she grew her business from the initial 5 to over 500 customers. Her enthusiasm for the job never left her. "My love for cosmetics and my love for people make the job fun... I call this my ministry because a lot of people I see just need someone to listen. I want to be a good listener and I have many

good memories from my customers". She was a lifetime member of Avon's prestigious Presidents Club and was later inducted into the Rose Circle within Avon Products, a level only the most outstanding Representatives have attained.
